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## Overview

The Winter School aims to empower language educators, curriculum developers, instructional designers, and assessment specialists with knowledge, tools, and strategies to integrate Artificial Intelligence (AI) in language education. Through a mix of theoretical input, practical workshops, and collaborative activities, participants will explore how AI can transform language learning environments, support differentiated instruction and enable intelligent and ethical assessment practices.

University teachers, teacher trainers, language center staff, educational technologists, and curriculum designers from partner institutions.

## Main Objectives

- To enhance understanding of AI technologies and their pedagogical implications for language education.
- To explore AI-driven tools for teaching, learning, and assessment in multilingual and multicultural settings.
- To engage participants in hands-on experience with AI-powered applications for adaptive learning, feedback, translation, and content creation.
- To promote ethical and responsible use of AI in education.
- To foster international cooperation and build a community of practice on AI-enhanced language education.

## Expected Outcomes

- Increased digital and AI literacy among participants.
- Knowledge and skills in selecting and implementing AI tools for language education.
- Prototypes of AI-based lesson plans and assessment activities.
- A shared repository of good practices and tools.
- Strengthened institutional collaboration among European and international partners.
